

**Theme: THE ATTITUDE OF THE BLIND MEN**

**Memory Verse:** *Matthew 20:31* “And the multitude rebuked them, because they should hold their peace: but they cried the more, saying, have mercy on us, O Lord, thou Son of David”.

**Texts: Acts 26:18**

The attitude of the blind men gives us a timeless message. We are to make the best use of the opportunities that come our way. Christians gathering or fellowship provide us special opportunities to plug into the power of the Spirit of God and have our vessels overfilled with divine blessings. The blind men called on the Lord at the right time, for they might not be able to see Him again.
