LESSION 15

Theme: THE IMPORTUNITY OF THE BLIND MEN

Memory Verse: *Matthew 7:7 "Ask and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock and it shall be opened unto you:"*

Texts: Luke 18:34-43

Moreover, the importunity of the blind men challenges us to knock repeatedly on heaven's door in prayer until the answer comes. The Bible enjoins us to knock until the answer comes. God does not expect us to give rest. We should pray day and night. They refused to be intimidated by the crowd; rather they pressed home their demand. Delay in answer to prayer, difficulties and inconveniences in reaching the place of fellowship should not stop us from continuing to knock at heaven's door.

Again, the two blind men were specific in their prayer. They categorically told Christ (even though He was already aware of their plight) to restore their sight. Sometimes, when we muddle up our requests in prayers, answer may be denied or delayed. It is remarkable that consequent upon their healing, the two blind men decided to follow Jesus. This is the response God expects of all saved souls.

They are to consecrate their all to Christ and continue to follow Him. Jesus once told a man He cured of thirty-eight years infirmity to sin no more, lest a worse thing should befall him. Christ's compassion on the blind is instructive. Many are helpless around us. They live in misery that is worse than physical blindness. Christians should have compassion on them and rise up to win their souls before they are eternally lost.
