Theme: REWARD FOR THE LABOURERS

Memory Verse: Rev. 2:10 "Fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer: behold, the devil shall cast some of you into prison, that ye may be tried; and ye shall have tribulation ten days: be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life".

Texts: Mathew 20:8-10; Roman 8:18; Hebrews 6:10

The labourers were all rewarded at the end of the day. Some had worked for only single hour but the farmer generously rewarded them, paying them the same as those who had laboured through out the day because they had worked for as long as they had the opportunity to work. God, in His sovereignty, rewards faithfulness, not the volume or size of our labour.

It is the labourer that endures to the end that will receive reward. If any of the labourers had abandoned the work mid-way, such would have missed the reward. The Lord replied the servants that who complained: "Friend, I do thee no wrong: didst not thou agree with me for a penny. (Mathew 20:13). It is not your complained but your faithfulness and dutifulness.

The Lord who enlists the labourers into His vineyard is faithful to reward all who diligently labour to the end. Whatever service you render to the Lord, will be rewarded bountifully here and hereafter. "For God is not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love, which ye have showed toward his name, in that ye have ministered to the saints, and do minister". (Hebrews 6:10). The Lord says: "And, behold, I come quickly; and my reward is with me, to give every man according as his work shall be". (Revelation 22:12).
