

Theme: AUTHORITY BEQUEATHED (GRANTED)

Memory Verse: *John 15:16 “Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain: that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you.”*

Texts: John 14:12-14; Luke 10:19; James 1:5-6

The surprise expressed by the disciples of Jesus at the blasting of the fig tree brought an eternal truth from Jesus to His disciples on the necessity of faith. “Jesus answered and said unto them, Verily I say unto you, If ye have faith, and doubt not, ye shall not only do this which is done to the fig tree, but also if ye say to this mountain, Be thou removed, and be cast into the sea; it shall be done”

In this statement, we can at once see the necessity of faith, the potency of faith and the victory of faith. Jesus granted on the believers an awesome power of attorney via the instrumentality of faith. Jesus, here, promised (or transfers) the same power to do whatever He said, to all believers. Believers need not to fear anyone. There is authority given to us.

Jesus has given us power over the enemy, situation and circumstances. Unfortunately, many believers still live in fear. They suffer daily because they lack faith. Naturally, we may see any need to literally move mountains or curse trees, but “if ye have faith and doubt,” “all things, whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive” What a great inheritance, If believer could simply and wholeheartedly hold on to these words, what a great triumph they will bring the body of Christ.
