

Theme: BLIND EYES OPENED

Memory Verse: *Isaiah 62:6-7* “I have set watchmen upon thy walls, O Jerusalem, which shall never hold their peace day nor night: ye that make mention of the Lord, keep not silence, [7] And give him no rest, till he establish, and till he make Jerusalem a praise in the earth”.

Texts: Acts 26:16-18; Luke 18:35-43; 4:18

Jesus never closed His eyes to the needy. Still on His journey into Jerusalem and with suffering awaiting Him, Christ’s compassionate touch brought a miracle to two blind men sitting by the way side. Problems should not stop us from serving God nor showing mercy to others. Even as our Lord did not look at what was before Him and open the eyes of these blind men, we should not allow anything to stop us in the service of the Lord.

We should be like Christ. The blind men were quick to recognise Jesus as the promised Messiah, since “son of David” is a Messianic title. At any rate, their faith in Christ was honoured. Their prayer could not be silenced by the multitude. “And the multitude rebuked them, because they should hold their peace: but they cried the more saying, Have mercy on us, O Lord, thou son of David” (Mathew 20:31).

Enumerate the lessons we learn from the healing of the two blind men. Even though they were blind and they cannot see at that period of time, yet with faith they cried unto Jesus to have mercy on them. Whatever made Christ to forget about what was before Him to heal them is what we should think of? Beloved, your faith will remove every veil covering your eyes if only you will cry to the Messiah.
